Welcome to our 2019 Easter morning worship. I hope that you are ready to celebrate Jesus Christ, the risen Lord of All. If you are visiting with us today, please return again soon.

For many, Easter is nothing more than a day to “hide eggs and to eat a lot of chocolate.” For others, it’s a time for family and friends to gather together for a good meal and making memories. But I want to suggest that Easter is a much bigger deal than what the world understand.

So, what should Easter mean to us? Well, since Jesus died and rose again, it means that believers do not have to be afraid of death. As 1 Corinthians 15:20 tells us, **“But the fact is, Christ has been raised from the dead. He has become the first of a great harvest of those who will be raised to life again” (NLT)**. Jesus has gone to the other side, He has returned, and He has the keys to death and hell (see Revelation 1:18).

It’s hard for us to accept that our bodies are wearing out. Yet the Bible says we will have new bodies one day: **“We, too, wait anxiously for that day when God will give us our full rights as his children, including the new bodies he has promised us” (Romans 8:23 NLT)**.

You see, my body is not the real me. The real me is my soul, my spirit. This body will die. But my soul will live on.

Each of us as believers have that promise. I am so thankful that Jesus was willing to die for all, even while they were sinners. We have hope beyond the grave because Jesus conquered death. Thank you, Jesus!

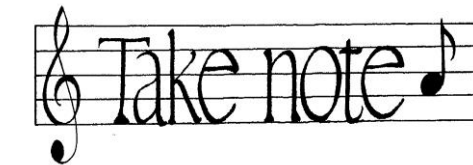
